

A NOTE FROM JANICE AND EDWIN HOPPER

In 1989 we bought The Resort at The Mountain, then known as Rippling River Resort. The purchase included numerous lots, including this one. On the purchase date we did not have plans to make this our primary home, but the enchanting mountains, the golf course and friendly neighbors caused us to sell our country home in Washington County and "Move to the Mountain".

The name was changed to The Resort at the Mountain and a very authentic Scottish/European motif was adopted including artwork, European antiques, and an extensive remodeling of the golf course.

It was natural for us to follow that same European style when we built this house that we finished in 1995. All of the furnishings are gone, but many accents still remain such as the extensive use of heavy trim, decorative wall paper, the antique fixture in the entry, the black and white tiles in the master bath, cherry hardwood floors and the warming bench in front of a Scottish fire place and surround.

A four story model was built complete with an elevator to insure that all four floors can be accessed.

There are a number of items a prospective owner might find interesting:

The bedroom on the lower floor was used as an office and is wired to accommodate fast internet, and has a dedicated circuit from the electric panel.

A 1,000 gallon propane tank is buried in front of the garage.

All of the flower beds with bark dust have drip irrigation.

There are two complete systems for heating and cooling. The third and fourth floors are served by their own thermostat, as is the main floor. The lower floor is served by wall heaters.

The home comes with a generator in case of power outages and is protected by a whole house surge protector.

Open your windows and doors and hear the soothing sounds of the Salmon River just across the fairway.

Walk to fine dining or a quick sack at the restaurant around the corner at the hotel.

We hope that you will enjoy this home and the "mountain" experience as much as we did.
